Club at Briarcliff resumes literature series

Building on the launch of its Literature Series in last year, The

Club at Briarcliff Manor is partnering again with Westchester Community College to present a six-session lecture and discussion class to be held Tuesday afternoons from March 22 to May 10.

The complimentary six sessions will be held March 22, March 29, April 5, April 12, April 26, May 3 and May 10. Classes, which will run from 1 to 2:30 p.m., will be held at The Club's new Information & Design Center at 25 Scarborough Road, Briarcliff Manor. Participants are encouraged to attend all six sessions.

In this Literature Series, participants will explore the idea of "the story," discussing how stories are created and examining how they're adapted and changed. They will have the opportunity to do close readings of highly varied texts, including personal narratives, essays and short stories, and to engage in lively and animated discussions. Authors may include John Barth, Elizabeth Bishop, Jorge Luis Borges, John Cage, Annie Dillard, Arthur Conan Doyle, Herman Melville, W.S. Merwin and Vladimir Nabokov. Space is limited. The classes will be conducted by Clark M. Jackowe, Adjunct English Professor at Westchester Community College. Mr. Jackowe, who has been

a guest lecturer at New York University, holds a bachelor's degree from Purchase College and a master's from New York University. He has won numerous awards including a first prize in the Academy of American Poets' poetry competition.
